



To complete the Girls Golf Rocks application form you will need to have the following information to hand:

PGA Professional details:

- PGA number of Professional who would deliver the Girls Golf Rocks programme
- SafeGolf accreditation date

Girls Golf Rocks Co-ordinator:

As part of the programme each club will need to appoint a Girls Golf Rocks Coordinator. This person will act as a second point of contact to receive important information about the programme. This must be a different person from the PGA Professional who is responsible for delivering the programme.

Safe Golf:

All clubs who are affiliated to England Golf must achieve the SafeGolf standard as a minimum and we will support clubs to become SafeGolf accredited.

If you are already SafeGolf accredited, please ensure you have this date ready.

Those clubs who are not affiliated to England, but are a HSBC Golf Roots Centre will need to ensure they have the following:

- The date of the Club Welfare Officer DBS check
